**CHILD SUPPORT ORDER**

**1. Money Judgment Summary**

No money judgment is ordered.

➤ **Findings and Orders**

**2.** The court orders child support as part of this family law case. This is a *(check one)*:

temporary order.  final order.

**3.** The *Child Support Schedule Worksheets* attached or filed separately are approved by the court and made part of this Order.

**4. Parents' contact and employment information**

Each parent must fill out and file with the court a *Confidential Information* form (FL All Family 001) including personal identifying information, mailing address, home address, and employer contact information.

**Important!** If you move or get a new job any time while support is still owed, you must:

- Notify the Support Registry, and
- Fill out and file an updated *Confidential Information* form with the court.

**Warning!** Any notice of a child support action delivered to the last address you provided on the *Confidential Information* form will be considered adequate notice, if the party trying to serve you has shown diligent efforts to locate you.

12 **6. Imputed Income**

To calculate child support, the court may **impute** income to a parent:

- whose income is unknown, or
- who the Court finds is unemployed or under-employed by choice.

Imputed income is not actual income. It is an assigned amount the court finds a parent could or should be earning. (RCW 26.19.071(6))

18 **7. Limits affecting the monthly child support amount**

Combined Monthly Net Income over \$12,000. Together the parents earn more than \$12,000 per month (*Worksheets* line 4). The child support amount:

is the presumptive amount from the economic table.

22 **8. Standard Calculation**

**All children living together** – All of the children are living with Sonya most of the time. The other parent must pay child support. The standard calculation from the *Child Support Schedule Worksheets* line 17 for the parent paying support is \$1,922.06 for the first 24 months; and then, \$2,080.12 for the next 24 months.

25 **9. Deviation from standard calculation**

Should the monthly child support amount be different from the standard calculation?

1  No – The monthly child support amount ordered in section 10 is the **same** as the standard  
2 calculation listed in section 8 because:

3  Neither parent asked for a deviation from the standard calculation.

4 **10. Monthly child support amount (transfer payment)**

5 After considering the standard calculation and whether or not to apply a deviation, the court  
6 orders the following monthly child support amount (transfer payment).

7  **All children living together** – Michael DeLance must pay child support to Sonya DeLance  
8 each month as follows for the children listed below (*add lines for additional children if

11 **\*\* Father is paying undifferentiated family support to Mother, inclusive of  
12 monthly child support. There is no separate transfer payment for monthly child  
13 support.**

14 **11. Starting date and payment schedule**

15 The monthly child support amount must be paid starting April 1, 2019, paid concurrently with  
16 undifferentiated family support pursuant to the Separation Contract and Property Settlement  
17 Agreement.

18 *Father paid support on 4/15/2019 for April 2019 through*

19 **12. Step Increase (for modifications or adjustments only)**

*March 2020*

20  Does not apply.

21 **13. Periodic Adjustment**

22  Child support may be changed according to state law. The Court is not ordering a specific  
23 periodic adjustment schedule below.

24 Neither parent may move for modification or adjustment of support Child Support during  
25 period father is also paying Spousal Support to mother. During this same period, in no  
26 event shall the total package of support be reduced below the currently ordered spousal  
support and child support combined.

1 **14. Payment Method**

2 Send payment to the:

- 3  By direct deposit to an account designated by the mother, which information may be updated from time to time.

4 **15. Enforcement through income withholding (garnishment)**

5 DCS or the person owed support can collect the support owed from the wages, earnings, assets or benefits of the parent who owes support, and can enforce liens against real or personal property as allowed by any state's child support laws without notice to the parent who owes the support.

7 *If this order is not being enforced by DCS and the person owed support wants to have support paid directly from the employer, the person owed support must ask the court to sign a separate wage assignment order requiring the employer to withhold wages and make payments. (Chapter 26.18 RCW.)*

10 Income withholding may be delayed until a payment becomes past due if the court finds good reason to delay.

- 11  Does not apply. There is no good reason to delay income withholding.

12 **16. End date for support**

13 Support must be paid for each child until:

- 14  the child turns 18 or is no longer enrolled in high school, whichever happens last, unless the court makes a different order in section 17.

15 **17. Post-secondary educational support (for college or vocational school)**

16  Granted – The parents must pay for the children's post-secondary educational support. Post-secondary educational support may include support for the period after high school and before college or vocational school begins. The amount or percentage each person must pay:

18  is as follows: Michael DeLance shall pay for the post secondary educational support of the child that are not paid by scholarships, grants, and educational trust funds. Father shall establish and fund an educational account in the amount of \$250,000 per child designated for payment of the children's post-secondary support expenses, to include room and board, tuition, books, fees, health insurance, and a reasonable allowance.

21 All distributions from the account require notice to Wife at least 14 days in advance and must be for the purpose of the children's post-secondary educational needs. Wife shall receive statements from Husband verifying the status of the account on at least a quarterly basis.

24 Post-secondary educational expenses shall consist of tuition, books and supplies, fees, room and board, health insurance, uninsured health costs, tutoring and special classes, driver's liability insurance, and a reasonable amount for clothing, transportation and miscellaneous expenses.

26 The child must enroll in an accredited academic or vocational school, must be actively

1 pursuing a course of study commensurate with the child's vocational goals, and must be in  
2 good academic standing as defined by the institution. The court-ordered postsecondary  
3 educational support shall be automatically suspended during the period or periods the child  
4 fails to comply with these conditions.

5 The child shall also make available all academic records and grades to both parents as a  
6 condition of receiving postsecondary educational support. Each parent shall have full and  
7 equal access to the postsecondary education records as provided in RCW 26.09.225.

8 Postsecondary educational expenses shall not extend beyond the child's twenty-third  
9 birthday, except for exceptional circumstances, such as mental, physical, or emotional  
10 disabilities.

11 Parental contributions for post-majority educational expenses shall be made directly to the  
12 educational institution insofar as is feasible. If direct payments are not feasible, then the  
13 payments shall be made directly to the child if the child does not reside with either parent. If  
14 the child resides with one of the parents, the parent making the support transfer payment shall  
15 make the payments either to the child or to the parent who has been receiving the support  
16 transfer payments. Room and board shall be paid during summer months between spring and  
17 fall school sessions.

## 18. Claiming children as dependents on tax forms

- 18  The parties have the right to claim the children as their dependents on their tax forms as  
19 follows:
- 20  Every year – Sonya has the right to claim Ella and Michael has the right to claim  
21 Presley. When there is only one child eligible as a dependant for tax purposes, the  
22 parents shall alternate the exception with Sonya claiming in odd tax years and Michael  
23 claiming in even tax years.
  - 24  Other: the non-custodial parent shall only have the right to claim a child as a dependent  
25 if that parent is current in all support obligations by December 15<sup>th</sup> of that tax year.

26 For tax years when a non-custodial parent has the right to claim the children, the parents  
must cooperate to fill out and submit IRS Form 8332 in a timely manner.

**Warning!** Under federal law, the parent who claims a child as a dependent may owe a tax  
penalty if the child is not covered by health insurance.

## 19. Health Insurance

**Important!** Read the Health Insurance Warnings at the end of this order.

- 22  Michael DeLance must pay the premium to provide health, dental, and vision insurance  
23 coverage for the children. The court has considered the needs of the children, the cost and  
24 extent of coverage, and the accessibility of coverage.
- 25  The other parent is excused from paying his/her proportional share\* of the premium  
26 paid by agreement of the parties, in light of their disproportionate estates and earnings.
- are included on the *Worksheets* (line 14). No separate payment is needed.

\* Proportional share is each parent's percentage share of the combined net income  
from line 6 of the Child Support Schedule Worksheets.

1 **20. Health insurance if circumstances change or court has not ordered**

2 If the parties' circumstances change, or if the court is not ordering how health insurance must  
3 be provided for the children in section 19:

- 4 ■ A parent, non-parent custodian, or DCS can enforce medical support.
- 5 ■ If a parent does not provide proof of accessible private insurance (insurance that can be  
6 used for the children's primary care), that parent may have to:  
7     Get (or keep) insurance through his/her work or union, unless the insurance costs  
8     more than 25% of his/her basic support obligation (line 19 of the *Worksheets*),  
9     Pay his/her share of the other parent's monthly premium up to 25% of his/her basic  
10     support obligation (line 19 of the *Worksheets*), or  
11     Pay his/her share of the monthly cost of any public health care coverage, such as  
12     Healthy Kids, BHP, or Medicaid, for which there is an assignment.

13 **21. Children's expenses not included in the monthly child support amount**

14 **Uninsured medical expenses** – Each parent is responsible for a share of uninsured medical  
15 expenses as ordered below. Uninsured medical expenses include premiums, co-pays,  
16 deductibles, and other health care costs not covered by insurance. A parent can ask DCS to  
17 collect those expenses, or a parent or non-parent custodian can ask the court for a judgment.





- DOL or other licensing agencies may deny, suspend, or refuse to renew your licenses, including your driver's license and business or professional licenses, and
- Dept. of Fish and Wildlife may suspend or refuse to issue your fishing and hunting licenses and you may not be able to get permits. (RCW 74.20A.320)

**If you receive child support...**

You may have to:

- Document how that support and any cash received for the children's health care was spent.
- Repay the other parent for any day care or special expenses included in the support if you didn't actually have those expenses. (RCW 26.19.080)

**Medical Support Warnings!**

**The parents** must keep the Support Registry informed whether or not they have access to health care coverage for the children at a reasonable cost, and provide the policy information for any such coverage.

**If you are ordered to provide children's health care coverage...**

You have **20 days** from the date of this order to send:

- proof that the children are covered, or
- proof that health care coverage is not available as ordered.

Send your proof to the other parent or to the Support Registry (if your payments go there).

If you do **not** provide proof of health care coverage:

- The other parent or the support agency may contact your employer or union, without notifying you, to ask for direct enforcement of this order (RCW 26.18.170), and
- The other parent may:
  - Ask the Division of Child Support (DCS) for help,
  - Ask the court for a contempt order, or
  - File a Petition in court.

**Don't** cancel your employer or union health insurance for your children unless the court approves or your job ends and you no longer qualify for insurance as ordered in section **19**.

If an insurer sends you payment for a medical provider's service:

- you must send it to the medical provider if the provider has not been paid; or
- you must send the payment to whoever paid the provider if someone else paid the provider; or
- you may keep the payment if you paid the provider.

If the children have public health care coverage, the state can make you pay for the cost of the monthly premium.

**Always** inform the Support Registry and any parent if your access to health care coverage changes or ends.
