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**Modified Final Child Support Order**

**1. Money Judgment Summary**

No money judgment is ordered.

***Findings and Orders***

2. The court orders child support as part of this family law case. This is a Final order.
3. The *Child Support Schedule Worksheets* attached or filed separately are approved by the court and made part of this Order.

**4. Parents' contact and employment information**

Each parent must fill out and file with the court a *Confidential Information* form (FL All Family 001) including personal identifying information, mailing address, home address, and employer contact information.

**Important!** If you move or get a new job any time while support is still owed, you must:

- Notify the Support Registry, and
- Fill out and file an updated *Confidential Information* form with the court.

**Warning!** Any notice of a child support action delivered to the last address you provided on the *Confidential Information* form will be considered adequate notice, if the party trying to serve you has shown diligent efforts to locate you.

**6. Imputed Income**

To calculate child support, the court may **impute** income to a parent:

- whose income is unknown, or
- who the Court finds is unemployed or under-employed by choice.

*Imputed income is not actual income. It is an assigned amount the court finds a parent could or should be earning. (RCW 26.19.071(6))*

**7. Limits affecting the monthly child support amount**

**Combined Monthly Net Income over \$12,000.** Together, the parents earn more than \$12,000 per month (*Worksheets* line 4). The child support amount:

The estimated total amount of the transfer payment from the present date to Ella's 18<sup>th</sup> birthday is approximately \$500,000. The Petitioner/Mother acknowledges receipt of this amount through the Respondent/Father's forgiveness of a \$500,000 loan owed pursuant to the Decree of Dissolution. The Respondent/Father has forgiveness this loan in lieu of making any future child support transfer payments.

**9. Deviation from standard calculation**

Should the monthly child support amount be different from the standard calculation?

Yes- The monthly child support obligation is less than the standard calculation for the person paying support because the parents have agreed on prepayment of child support in lieu of a monthly payment.

**10. Monthly child support amount (transfer payment)**

After considering the standard calculation in section 8, and whether or not to apply a deviation in section 9, the court orders the following monthly child support amount (transfer payment).

Michael DeLance is the obligor and Sonya DeLance is the obligee. However, there shall be no transfer payment between the parties as the parties have agreed on a lump sum prepayment of the child support amount.

1 **11. Starting date and payment schedule**

2 This order goes into effect on December 1, 2021 and the monthly child support amount must be  
3 paid starting **December 1, 2021** on the following payment schedule:

4 In one payment each month by the 1st day of the month.

5 **12. Step Increase (for modifications or adjustments only)**

6 Does not apply.

7 **13. Periodic Adjustment**

8 This order shall remain in effect until Ella's 18<sup>th</sup> birthday or upon her graduation from high school,  
9 whichever happens last.

10 **14. Payment Method** (*check either Registry or Direct Pay*)

11 Other – There is no transfer payment required.

12 **Important!** *If you are ordered to send your support payments to the Washington State  
13 Support Registry, and you pay some other person or organization, you will **not** get credit  
14 for your payment.*

15 **DCS Enforcement: There is no need for DCS to enforce this order as there is no transfer  
16 payment required.**

17 **15. Enforcement through income withholding (garnishment)**

18 DCS or the person owed support can collect the support owed from the wages, earnings, assets, or  
19 benefits of the parent who owes support, and can enforce liens against real or personal property as  
20 allowed by any state's child support laws without notice to the parent who owes the support.

21 *If this order is **not** being enforced by DCS and the person owed support wants to have support paid  
22 directly from the employer, the person owed support must ask the court to sign a separate wage  
23 assignment order requiring the employer to withhold wages and make payments. (Chapter 26.18  
24 RCW.)*

Income withholding may be delayed until a payment becomes past due if the court finds good  
reason to delay.

Does not apply. There is no good reason to delay income withholding.

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3 **16. Temporary reduction if incarcerated (abatement)**

4 *Important! Read Support Abatement Warnings at the end of this order.*

5 If the person who owes support is incarcerated:

- 6     ▪ The total monthly child support amount may be temporarily reduced to \$10 while the person who owes support is in jail, prison, or a correctional facility for at least six months (or serving a sentence of more than six months), and has no income or assets available to pay the support.
- 7     ▪ If reduced, the support amount will be \$10 a month.
- 8     ▪ Beginning the fourth month after the person who owes support is released, support will be 50% of the original amount, or \$50 per child, whichever is more.
- 9     ▪ One year after release, support will return to the original amount in section 10.
- 10    ▪ Reinstatement of the support amount at 50% does not automatically apply, if a *Petition to Modify Child Support Order* is filed during the period of abatement.

12 **17. End date for support**

13 This order shall terminate on Ella's 18<sup>th</sup> birthday or her graduation from high school, whichever happened last.

14 **18. Post-secondary educational support (for college or vocational school)**

15 Either party may elect to pay post-secondary expenses for either child, but neither shall be  
16 required to contribute to post-secondary expenses for either child.

17 **19. Tax Issues**

18 The Petitioner/Mother shall have the right to claim both children every year. If the  
19 Respondent/Father claims either child, that shall be deemed contempt of this order. The  
20 Petitioner/Mother shall be permitted to enter an Ex Parte Judgment directing the  
Respondent/Father to amend any tax return in which he has claimed the children and shall be  
awarded all reasonable fees and costs incurred in obtaining any such judgment.

21 **20. Medical Support**

22 *Important! Read the Medical Support Warnings at the end of this order. Medical Support includes*  
23 *health insurance (both public and private) and cash payments towards premiums and uninsured*  
*medical expenses.*

**Private health insurance ordered.** The Petitioner/Mother shall provide health insurance for the children. This has been factored into the prepayment amount received by the Petitioner/Mother and no separate payment is necessary.

**21. Health care coverage if circumstances change or court has not ordered**

If the parties' circumstances change, or if the court is not ordering how health care coverage must be provided for the children in section 19:

- A parent, non-parent custodian, or DCS can enforce the medical support requirement.
- If a parent does not provide proof of accessible health care coverage (coverage that can be used for the children's primary care), that parent must:
  - Get (or keep) insurance through his/her work or union, unless the insurance costs more than 25% of his/her basic support obligation (line 19 of the *Worksheets*),
  - Pay his/her share of the other parent's monthly premium up to 25% of his/her basic support obligation (line 19 of the *Worksheets*), or
  - Pay his/her share of the monthly cost of any public health care coverage, such as Apple Health or Medicaid, which is assigned to the state.

**22. Children's expenses not included in the monthly child support amount**

**Uninsured medical expenses** - Each parent is responsible for a share of uninsured medical expenses as ordered below. Uninsured medical expenses include premiums, co-pays, deductibles, and other health care costs not paid by health care coverage.

\*\*The parents agree that the Mother shall pay 100% of the children's uninsured or extraordinary health care expenses, including, but not limited to, co-payments, prescriptions, dental care, vision, orthodontia, etc. There shall be no reimbursement required from Father to Mother for health care expenses for the children incurred by the Mother. The Father may elect to pay for any of these expenses, but there shall be no reimbursement required from the Mother to the Father, but it is in the Father's discretion to pay these expenses. No transfer shall be required between the parties whatsoever.

The Mother shall pay 100% of the children's expenses and there shall be no reimbursement required from Father to Mother for expenses incurred by the Mother. The Father may elect to pay for any of the children's expenses, but there shall be no reimbursement required from the Mother to the Father, as it is in the Father's discretion to pay these expenses. No transfer shall be required between the parties whatsoever.

10 Upon entry of this Order, the Respondent/Father shall have prepaid all child support amounts including the transfer payment and shared expenses in the amount of \$500,000. The Respondent/Father’s support obligations have therefore been satisfied in full.

1 **Warnings!**

2 **If you don't follow this child support order...**

- 3 • DOL or other licensing agencies may deny, suspend, or refuse to renew your licenses, including your driver's license and business or professional licenses, and
- 4 • Dept. of Fish and Wildlife may suspend or refuse to issue your fishing and hunting licenses and you may not be able to get permits. (RCW 74.20A.320)

2 **If you receive child support...**

You may have to:

- 3 • Document how that support and any cash received for the children's health care was spent.
- 4 • Repay the other parent for any day care or special expenses included in the support if you didn't actually have those expenses. (RCW 26.19.080)

7 **Support Abatement Warnings!**

8 The Division of Child Support (DCS), the person required to pay support, the payee under this order, or the person entitled to receive support **may ask the court or DCS to temporarily reduce** child support to \$10 per month when the person required to pay support is in jail, prison, or a correctional facility for at least six months, or serving a sentence of more than six months.

10 There is a rebuttable presumption that an incarcerated person cannot pay child support. DCS, the payee under this order, or the person receiving the support may overcome the presumption by showing that the person required to pay support has income or other assets available to pay support.

11 When a request for abatement is made, DCS will review its records and other available information, and decide if abatement is appropriate. DCS will send notice of the decision to the person required to pay support, and to the payee under this order or the person entitled to receive support. Any of those persons may object to DCS's decision.

13 If at any point during the period of incarceration, a person or DCS later learns of income or other assets available to pay support, a request to terminate or reverse the abatement may be made through DCS or the Office of Administrative Hearings.

15 **Medical Support Warnings!**

16 **The parents** must keep the Support Registry informed whether or not they have access to health care coverage for the children at a reasonable cost, and provide the policy information for any such coverage.

18 **If you are ordered to provide children's health care coverage...**

19 You have **20 days** from the date of this order to send:

- 19 • proof that the children are covered, or
- 20 • proof that health care coverage is not available as ordered.

20 Send your proof to the other parent or to the Support Registry (if your payments go there).

21 If you do **not** provide proof of health care coverage:

- 21 • The other parent or the support agency may contact your employer or union, without notifying you, to ask for direct enforcement of this order (RCW 26.18.170), and
- 22 • The other parent may:
  - 23 • Ask the Division of Child Support (DCS) for help,
  - 23 • Ask the court for a contempt order, or

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- File a Petition in court.

**Don't** cancel your employer or union health insurance for your children unless the court approves or your job ends and you no longer qualify for insurance as ordered in section **19**.

If an insurer sends you payment for a medical provider's service:

- you must send it to the medical provider if the provider has not been paid; or
- you must send the payment to whoever paid the provider if someone else paid the provider; or
- you may keep the payment if you paid the provider.

If the children have public health care coverage, the state can make you pay for the cost of the monthly premium.

**Always** inform the Support Registry and any parent if your access to health care coverage changes or ends.
